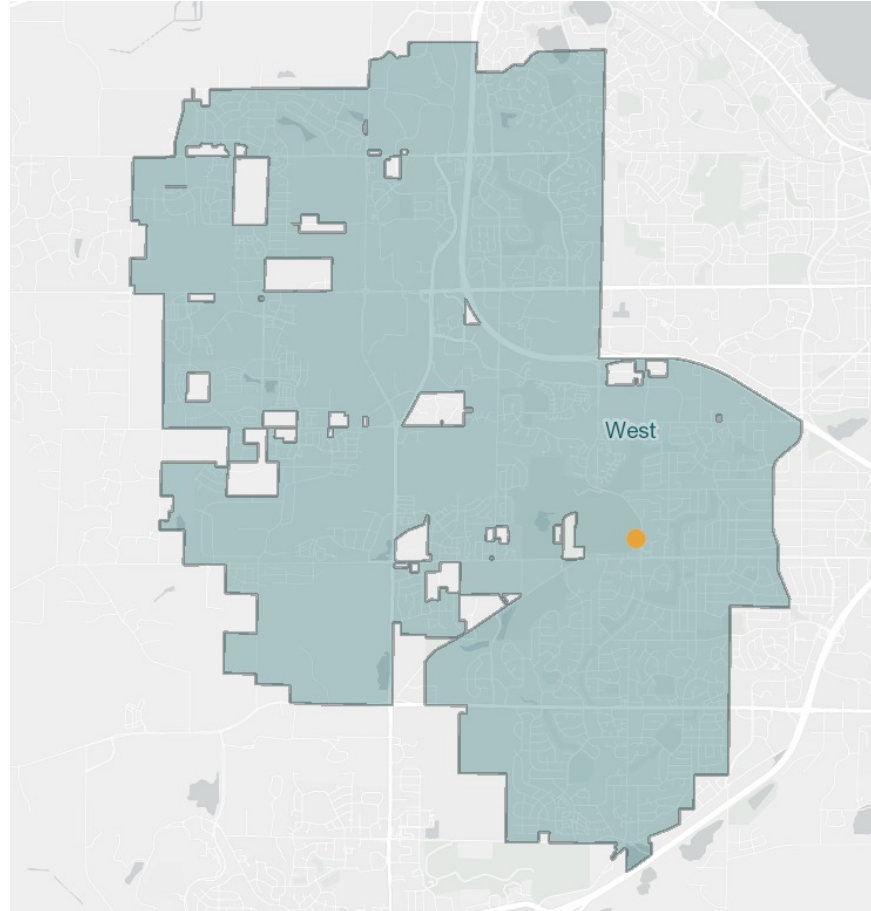

West Police District

- Approximate Population of 62,000 residents
 - Would make us the 11th largest city in WI if we were standalone
- Comprised of primarily residential and commercial properties
- More Historic Neighborhoods and Newly Constructed communities



Our District Personnel

- 1 Police Captain
- 2 Police Lieutenants
 - 1 Patrol and Operations Lieutenant
 - 1 Detective Lieutenant (Sensitive Crimes)
- 6 Police Sergeants
 - 5 patrol sergeants
 - 1 Community Policing Team (CPT) sergeant
- 8 Detectives
 - Cover Sensitive Crimes (Domestic Violence, Stalking, Sexually Based Crimes Against Adults, etc.) for 3 police districts (West, Midtown, South)
- 45 Police Officers
 - 36 Patrol Officers
 - 5 Community Policing Team (CPT) officers
 - 3 Neighborhood Officers (2 NPO's and 1 NRO)
 - 1 Mental Health Officer
- **62 TOTAL PERSONNEL**

Stratified Policing

- Theoretical Framework for Crime Reduction
 - Every person at MPD has a role in crime reduction
 - Accountability is the basis of the concept
- Combines the Following:
 - Enforcement
 - Community Engagement and Education
 - Partnerships
 - And much more!
- The Balsam/Russett area is the WPD Stratified Area
 - Based on crime trends over multi-year period



City-Wide Information

- Most “noteworthy,” crimes and incidents are shared via MPD’s Incident Report System- can subscribe for a daily digest
- “State of Public Safety,” address is provided by the Chief of Police Annually
- Chief provides Quarterly Reports to Common Council- also on MPD’s website
- MPD will also utilize social media (primarily Facebook) for more pressing information sharing that we need out widely
- Our Annual Reports (going back to 2006) are on the MPD website



City-Wide Information (cont.)

- Community Crime Map
 - On MPD website on “Data,” tab
 - Easier way to visualize and filter information
- MPD officers receive a monthly and quarterly summary of crime activity- utilize them for information sharing and tailoring responses
 - These are compiled into the Chief’s quarterly report to the Common Council

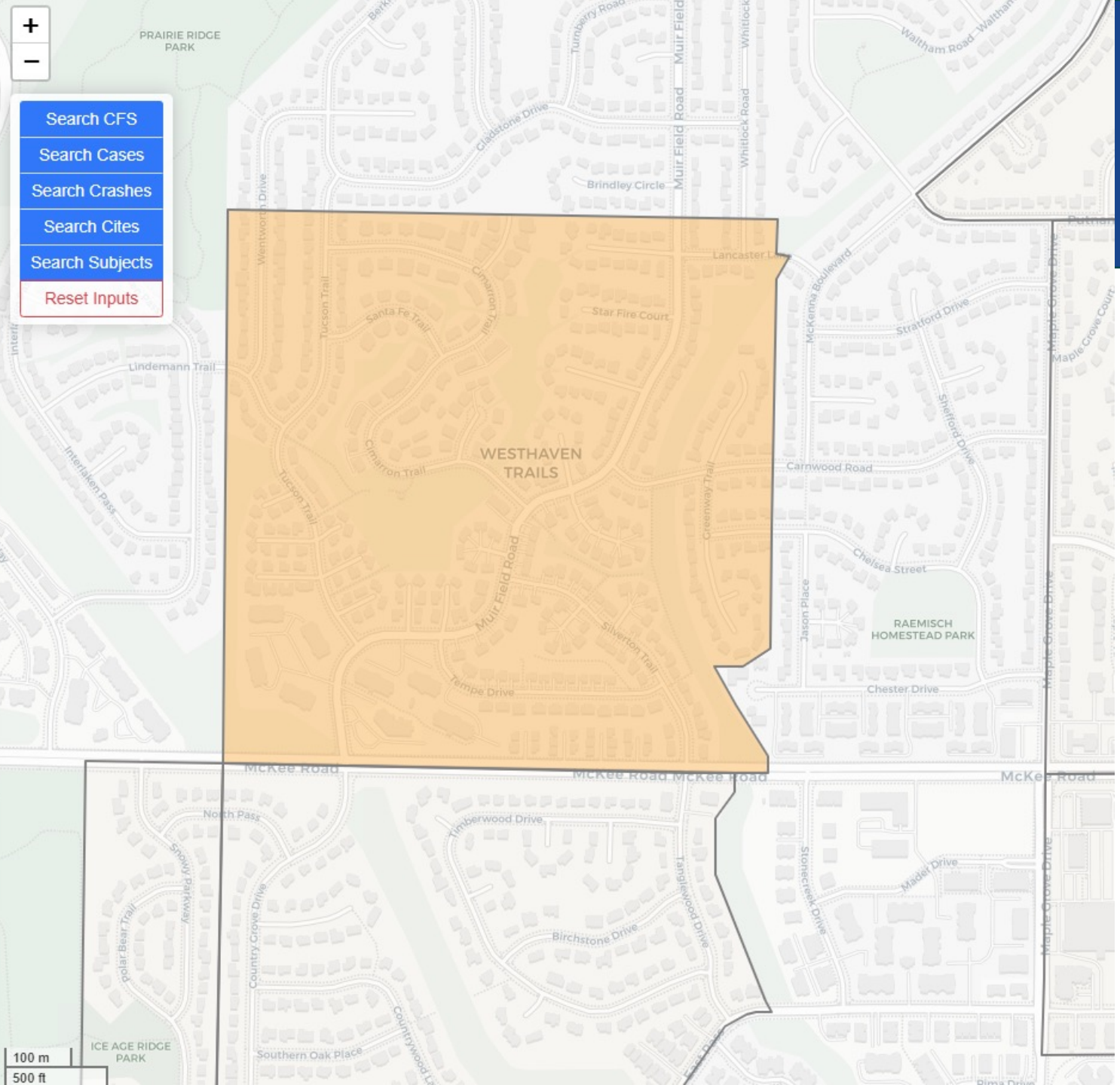

- Property Owned by Association IS PRIVATE PROPERTY
 - Meaning that consent to enter or do any kind of work (brush clearing, landscaping, etc.) would be needed
 - Actions taken against Board wishes could be trespassing
 - Please contact your board for more on this
- Incident on 3/15
 - Incident on Chester Dr. that prompted large police response
 - Open case, but revolved around the recovery of stolen cars and several people running from the area
 - No thought that there is ongoing danger or an issue
